Health Center 21 Computer Lab

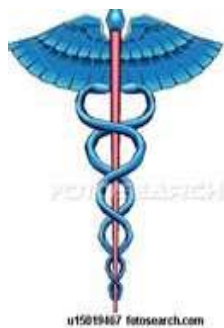
Each class will use this state of the art

Biotechnology Transformation New Name – Same Great Foundation

New, Improved, Expanded...

These are just some of words used to describe the changes happening in the Biotechnology Pathway.

Shifting the focus to health and science careers will give our students a better understanding of the breadth and depth of opportunities in the health care industry. We have lined up great community support in the form of speakers and internships geared towards various careers in health sciences and medical technology. Our new name, Health & Science Investigations Pathway, describes the shift in our curriculum to focus more on the human body and disease, as well as nutrition and sports medicine.

With this shift comes the opportunity to apply for grant money for teacher training, student activities and facility remodeling. We have plans to create a nursing lab complete with bedside monitors and mechanical patients for students to diagnose and treat. We have already received donations from hospitals, the latest being a microtome from John Muir in Concord, which we will use to make histology specimens to study the different tissues of the body.

Our program has most recently been acknowledged by SRJC as adequate preparation for Medical Terminology and after three years our students will have an option to test out of this class and receive three units of credit for HLC 160. This year we also hope to start a Health Occupation Students of America Club which promotes health in our community and allows students to attend and participate in local conferences.

Lots of great changes mean lots of fantastic opportunities for those already in the pathway and those that choose to join!!
